# Koffler Gallery Off-Site presents the first Canadian survey of acclaimed Israeli photographer Adi Nes

**Toronto, ON, March 27, 2012** – The **Koffler Gallery** of the **Koffler Centre of the Arts** is proud to present the first Canadian survey of the stunning, bold and often controversial work of internationally acclaimed Israeli photographer **Adi Nes**.

Curated by Mona Filip, the exhibition is presented off-site at Olga Korper Gallery 17 Morrow Ave, Toronto from May 3 to June 2, 2012 and opens with a free reception on Thursday, May 3, 6 to 9 PM.

"We are thrilled to be the first institution in Canada to present an in-depth survey of Adi Nes," said **Lori Starr**, Executive Director of the Koffler Centre of the Arts and Vice President, Culture, UJA Federation of Greater Toronto. "The Koffler Gallery is proud to contribute to the popular and scholarly discourse on his powerful work," added Starr.

Attesting to the importance of art in a society fraught with conflict, Nes' meticulously crafted images have become part of the collective visual culture beyond Israel. The exhibition includes Nes' most prominent photographs from the series *Soldiers* (1994-2000), *Boys* (2000) and *Biblical Stories* (2003-2006), including the iconic *untitled (The Last Supper Before Going Out to Battle)* (1999).

Referencing art history and photojournalism, Nes' interpretations of Biblical, mythological and literary themes propose a critical view of present day Israel, while seeking to uncover a universal humanism. His examinations of the military environment, tenement towns and the fringes of Israeli society take on mythical dimensions, enabling a philosophical inquiry into the narratives that underlie national identity.

Nes' own sense of marginality – informed by his Kurdish and Iranian heritage, his queer identity and his experience growing up in the development town of Kiryat Gat – influence his artistic vision and provide a particular filter for the realities of his homeland. His perspective generates a meaningful and subversive exploration of notions of masculinity, as well as cultural and sexual identity, within contemporary Israeli and global contexts.

Adi Nes is a Featured Exhibition in the Scotiabank CONTACT Photography Festival.

Adi Nes will launch *The Village*, a brand new body of work in June 2012 at the Jack Shainman Gallery in New York. The show will also open in Paris at Praz-Delavallade in June and in Tel Aviv at Sommer Contemporary Art Gallery in September 2012.

Adi Nes was born in 1966 in Kiryat Gat and currently lives and works in Tel Aviv. The most prominent Israeli photographer today, Nes graduated from the photography department of the Bezalel Academy of Arts and Design in Jerusalem in 1992. Since then, his work has been widely exhibited in Israel as well as internationally, including solo shows at The Contemporary Jewish Museum, San Francisco, Wexner Center for the Arts, Columbus, Galerie Praz Delavallade, Paris, Tel Aviv Museum of Art, Fine Arts Museum of San Francisco, Museum of Contemporary Art, San Diego, and Melkweg Gallery, Amsterdam. He has also participated in numerous group exhibitions in venues such as the Freundeskreis Kulturbahnhof Eller, Dusseldorf, Museum of Fine Arts, Budapest, The Israel Museum, Jerusalem, P.S.1 Contemporary Art Center, New York among many others. Nes' works are in the collections of The Corcoran Gallery of Art, Washington, DC, The Israel Museum, Jerusalem, The Tel Aviv Museum of Art, Tel-Aviv, The Jewish Museum, New York, Museum of Contemporary Art, San Diego and Montreal Museum of Fine Arts, Canada. He is represented by Jack Shainman Gallery in New York, Sommer Contemporary Art in Tel Aviv, and Gallery Praz Delavallade in Paris. More information can be found at www.adines.com
