Koffler Centre of the Arts modernizes "radio drama" in *How to Build a Fire*, a serialized audio narrative from award-winning playwright Kat Sandler

Toronto, ON, January 12, 2016 – Adding to the exciting lineup of digital arts experiences hosted on Koffler.Digital, the Koffler Centre of the Arts has commissioned audience-favourite Kat Sandler and Theatre Brouhaha Productions for the riveting new audio drama *How to Build a Fire*.

Beginning **January 28**, **2016**, episodes will be released weekly – playing in the style of old-fashioned radio drama. Sandler's sharp writing and imaginative narrative contemporize the format for modern audiences who've whet their appetites with programs like *Welcome to Night Vale* and *Serial*.

Sandler, hailed by *The Toronto Star* as "the most exciting theatre voice in Toronto today," brings her trademark "HBO-style" to this six-part miniseries that features original music by **Peter Chapman**, and the voice talents of **Caitlin Driscoll**, **Tim Walker**, **Kat Letwin**, **Maria Ricossa**, **Tony Nappo**, **Maggie Butterfield**, **Daniel Pagett**, and **Colin Munch**. Editing and sound effects are by **the Brothers DePaul**, and the piece is co-created and dramaturged by **Daniel Pagett** and **Tom McGee**.

"People are listening to podcasts as voraciously as they listened to radio dramas in the 1940s," says **Natalie Kertes, Director of Literary and Theatre Programs** at the Koffler. "It's only natural to be excited for the fiction version of *Serial* or an episodic version of *The Truth*. A compelling story will capture people's attention no matter the form, and that is exactly what Kat Sandler has given us here!"

The story begins in the small fracking town of Winnisk, Alberta, where it's always been better to blend in. But there's something off about the Goodhand twins, Maisey and Sirus. On their sixteenth birthday, a mysterious blaze destroys half the town and Sirus is shot and killed. The sheriff claimed Sirus was running at her. She said he was on fire. She said he was smiling.

Paranoia begins to grip the town as a mysterious stranger employed by the fracking corporation, Pembrooke Oil, arrives and begins asking deep and probing questions that stir up old secrets. When a series of seemingly accidental fires begin to flare in Maisey's wake, hysteria takes hold... how far will the people of Winnisk go to stop history from repeating itself?
