The Vine Awards Shortlist: Diverse. Universal.

The Koffler Centre of the Arts is proud to announce the shortlist for the 2018 <u>Vine Awards</u> <u>for Canadian Jewish Literature</u>. Winners will be announced on 11th October at an Award Luncheon at the Windsor Arms Hotel, Toronto.

The Vine Awards honour both the best Canadian Jewish writers and Canadian authors who deal with Jewish subjects in four categories; fiction, non-fiction, history and young adult/children's literature; each with a prize of \$10,000. An additional \$10,000 prize for poetry will be awarded again in 2019. The jurors, Beverley Chalmers, Joseph Kertes and Lee Maracle, reviewed 59 entries.

"This year's books provide a widespread range of topics, from children's fantasy as well as science-based offerings, through autobiographical reviews of Canadians' contributions to their professional lives, to fictional fantasies, and to snapshots of historical moments in Jewish affairs. Choosing only the four 'best of the best' winners does not do justice to the

marvelous talent that our multiple writers have revealed." - Beverley Chalmers
